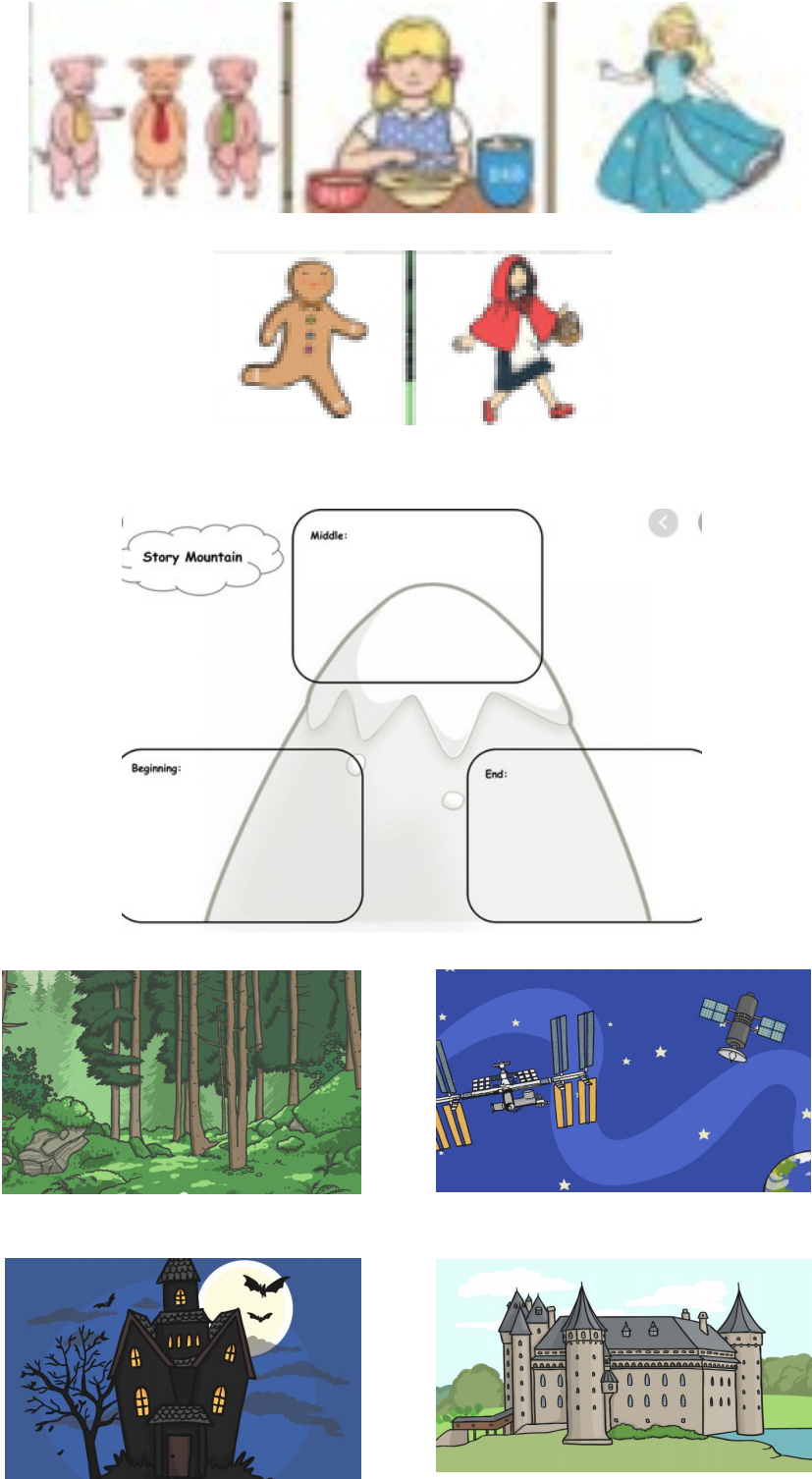


I am a fantastic reader

Tale	A narrative that relates to real or imaginary events.		When writing a story it needs to include characters, a setting and a plot for the story to make sense and interesting for the reader.
Sequence	The particular order of the story needed for it to make sense,		For a story to make sense the story of the structure all has a beginning, a middle and an end for the story to make sense
Beginning	The start of the story		Stories often include a hero and a villain, the common theme is that the hero defeats the villain and includes a happy ending.
Middle	In between the beginning and end, often features plot twists and the build of the story		Stories normally have a meaning behind their plot and try to teach the reader something for example Little Red Riding Hood is teaching you not to talk to strangers.
End	The final part of the story		Reading is a lifelong skill and with practice you can be a fantastic reader.
Setting	Where the story takes place		If you find a word you are not sure of when you are reading you can use your Fred talk, read the word to help you.
Character	A character is a human, animal, being or thing in a story.		Reading is great fun! Reading for pleasure can benefit a child's education, social and cognitive development, their wellbeing, and their mental health.
Special friends	2 letters than make one sound.		
Fred talk	Saying the sounds out loud before you blend them together.		
Fred in your head	Fred talk in your head and then say the word out loud.		
Polysyllabic words	Words with more than one syllable e.g. ham-mer hammer		
Fluency	Accurately and automatically reading words.
