Pharaoh	The supreme ruler of all of Ancient Egypt.		<p><u>What was the Ancient Egyptian religion?</u></p> <p>Religion played a big part in the lives of Ancient Egyptians. They believed in a whole variety of gods and goddesses. These took different forms, usually as animals.</p>
Mummification	The process in which the flesh and skin of a corpse (dead body) can be preserved.		<p><u>Who was Howard Carter?</u></p> <p>He was an archaeologist who discovered the tomb of Tutankhamun in 1922. This is famous because it was one of the only tombs that had not been raided so all Tutankhamun's belongings were still there.</p>
Papyrus	a material like paper used by ancient people to write on	 <p><i>Anubis—God of mummification</i></p>	<p><u>Who was Tutankhamun?</u></p> <p>Tutankhamun was a young pharaoh who ruled in the new kingdom. He was the last of the 18th dynasty.</p>
